



## ***Do you want to help raise dementia awareness in culturally diverse communities?***

In Australia, limited awareness of dementia in people from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds often results in delayed diagnosis, poorer prognosis, and a higher burden of care on families and health systems.

***Moving Pictures***, a collaborative project between NARI and Curtin University, is an innovative multi-media project which aims to change this through the production of fifteen short films co-produced with people from the Indian, Sri Lankan, Chinese and Arabic communities, some of the fastest growing CALD groups in Australia today. Curtin University Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC) has approved this study HRE2017-0758.
